council or board of selectmen of said cities and towns, any income received in a fiscal year not exceeding, in the aggregate, fifteen thousand dollars derived from the sale of products produced in a culinary arts program conducted in any public high school shall be deposited in a special fund by the school committee in any banking institution in the commonwealth. Expenditures may be made from said special fund by the school committee for the culinary arts program without further appropriation, notwithstanding the provisions of section fifty-three of chapter forty-four; provided, however, that said special fund shall not be used to pay the salary of any employee, and in any fiscal year no more than five thousand dollars from said fund shall be used for the purchase of equipment. The treasurer of a city or town shall annually audit the account of said special fund and shall submit copies thereof to the mayor, city council, city or town manager, board of selectmen and school committee of such city or town, and to the director of the bureau of accounts. In regional school districts, the school committee shall select the city or town treasurer from among member cities and towns to complete said audit and make such report.

Chap. 237. AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE SOURCE
OF WATER SUPPLY FOR THE CITY OF
BROCKTON.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 9 of chapter 371 of the acts of 1964 is hereby amended by striking out the seventh and eighth sentences and inserting in place thereof the following two sentences:- Control works shall be constructed to prevent diversions from Monponsett Pond when the water level in Monponsett Pond is below elevation fifty-two United States Coast and Geodetic Survey base. Notwithstanding the following provisions of section forty of chapter forty of the General Laws, water shall not be drawn from Furnace Pond below elevation fifty-six nor from Monponsett Pond below elevation fifty-two, United States Coast and Geodetic Survey base.

SECTION 1A. Said section 9 of said chapter 371 is hereby further amended by adding the following sentence:- Notwith-

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standing the provisions of said section forty and the provisions of this section, during the months of May through September in the year nineteen hundred and eighty-one, water may be directed into Silver Lake from Monponsett Pond in accordance with all other provisions of this section.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Chap. 238. AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE FILING OF ANNUAL REPORTS BY CORPORATIONS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Section 109 of chapter 156B of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the introductory paragraph, as amended by section 1 of chapter 214 of the acts of 1980, and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph:-

Every corporation shall annually, within thirty days after its annual meeting, prepare and submit to the state secretary a report which shall be signed under the penalties of perjury by an officer of the corporation, stating:.

Chap. 239. AN ACT PROVIDING FOR ABSENT VOTING FOR FEDERAL SERVICE PERSONNEL OUTSIDE THE TERRITORIAL LIMITS OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 51 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out section 50, as most recently amended by chapter 211 of the acts of 1975, and inserting in place thereof the following section:-

Section 50. Any legal resident of the commonwealth who was included in the definition of "Federal service personnel" in section one hundred and three B of chapter fifty-four during the periods when sessions for the registration of voters were held may appear before a registrar or assistant registrar of voters of the city or town of his legal residence, during regular business hours of any day following the final day for registration before a primary or election, as fixed by section twenty-six, and, in accordance with this chapter, register as a voter, provided he so appears prior to four o'clock post meridian on the day preceding a primary, preliminary election or election.
